## February 2024

#### Dear church family,

It has been almost a year since we began the search for a new pastor. During this time, the PNC reviewed a total of 31 matches and interviewed four candidates. Of the 31 matches, 23 were in the old system and we thought we were off to a good start. After talking to a few people to interview, we found out that many of the ministers didn't even know their PIF was still out there. Since the new system (August), we have had 9 matches. One of the PDPs that we were recently matched with didn't have any responses to the questions being asked and another PDP was written in another language. With there not being many candidates in the new system, and not great matches, we reached out to Tom Steensma and Matt Meinke for advice. We uploaded a brief "job" description on Maumee Valley Presbytery's website. Per recommendation, we also contacted two ministers in our area to see if they would be interested. One of the ministers was interested in our church and we started the interview process. Unfortunately, the minister didn't want to continue with the process after the second interview.

So where do we go from here? Do we want to wait for a full-time pastor and continue with the search as is? This might take a long time and even longer than we expected with the new system. Do we as a congregation have enough energy to continue without a pastor for another 6 months, a year, two years?

What should we as a congregation consider?

We can change the years of work experience we are requiring. This might open more doors for us if we are more open to a pastor fresh out of seminary. I will say, for some of the people we interviewed, this was a second career choice. They might not have many years of being a pastor, but they have a lot of life experience. If we make this change, we can make connections with seminaries here soon before the semester ends. This will help generate more pastors for us to look at and interview. I guess at this point we need to ask ourselves, is our church looking for experience as a pastor or life experience in our pastor?

We can see if another church would like to search with us for a shared pastor. There are a couple churches in our area that we could partner with for a shared pastor. However, Session has already reached out to a local church and this church shared with us that they would like to find their own full-time pastor. We can reach out to two other churches that are beginning their search. If either of the churches agree to share a pastor with us, this would require both PNCs to merge and we would start the process over in the system with the other church. The benefit is that we could provide a

strong salary to the pastor, and it wouldn't be so straining on our budget for the church. Our pledges this year did increase, but not where they should be for us to have a full-time pastor while keeping up with our building and other expenses. Sharing a pastor would also require us to be a little more flexible with our needs and wants in the pastor. Since the pastor will have two churches to manage, we will need to be accommodating when it comes to worship and church activities. Will the pastor want to live in between our churches or in one of our towns? Is Ottawa Presbyterian Church willing to share a pastor?

We can also change in the system from looking for a full-time pastor to a bi-vocational pastor. This means that the pastor could have another part-time job and be a part-time pastor for our church. This would make it easier on our budget for the church to have a part-time vs. a full-time pastor. We wouldn't be sharing the pastor with another church, but with another job. We will still have to be aware of the pastor's time with the other job. As a church, we have been able to make it through six months without a pastor and individuals have taken on a lot of the responsibilities of operating a church. Are we able to continue doing some of the jobs we have been doing without wearing ourselves out? I am not sure if in our area there are that many people with part-time jobs looking to be a part-time pastor, but we don't know this until we seek this option either inside or outside the CLC system. Are we willing to look at a bi-vocational pastor or even just a part-time pastor?

Our church will have a congregational meeting after our annual meeting on February 4<sup>th</sup>. The PNC would like to hear as many ideas and thoughts on what our next direction should be in our search. From the time you read this to the time we gather, I ask that everyone reflects, and pray on this. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to any of the PNC members, and myself for clarification.

We hope to see as many as possible at the congregational meeting. If you would like to submit any questions ahead of time to consider at this meeting, please contact me ahead of Feb. 4<sup>th</sup>. May God be with each of us.
