We celebrate World Communion every year, but we may not know much about its origins. It actually began in the PCUSA!

The following is an excerpt from the Presbyterian USA Mission website. World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor. Churches in other denominations were invited to celebrate with us from the beginning, but it wasn't until 1940 when the Department of Evangelism of the Federal Council of Churches (a predecessor body of the National Council of Churches) promoted extending the celebration to a number of churches around the world that the practice became widespread. Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed. World Communion Sunday is also a time when we receive the annual Peace and Global Witness Offering as a way of continuing the ancient Christian practice of sharing what we have with brothers and sisters in need.

World Communion 2024 will be celebrated on Sunday, October 6. Please join us with Christians from around the globe to partake in Communion and pray for peace.

CHALLENGED CHAMPIONS EQUESTRIAN CENTER, located outside of Ottawa, is a nonprofit therapeutic horseback riding center that helps over 450 individuals annually with special needs.
