

Dear stewards at Ottawa Presbyterian Church,

Happy new year! Well, liturgical year, that is! December 1 is the first day of Advent, when we start a new calendar year in the Revised Common Lectionary. This year - year C - is the final year of the three-year rotation, and we will start with Old Testament lessons from the prophets Jeremiah, Malachi, Zephaniah, Micah, and Isaiah. In the New Testament, we will read of the preparation for and the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ according to the Gospel of Luke.

During this season of Advent, we are invited to slow down and breathe; to remember the story of the season and the reason for Jesus' life and ministry; to do our work with love; and to listen to the word of God that directs our attention toward Christ's ministry of humility, justice, forgiveness, kindness, and hope.

In light of this season, you and your loved ones are invited to purposeful interaction with God and the Ottawa Presbyterian Church community:

- **Pause, Meditation, & Prayer:** The sanctuary will be open to the public on Mondays from 2-7 p.m. Resources for pause, meditation, and prayer will be available for use.
- **Bible Study:** We will study the prophets and Jesus' resistance starting on Monday, December 2 at 6:30 p.m. and continuing on Mondays at the same time throughout Advent. Please bring your Bible. Our first week's focus is Jeremiah. Read what you can beforehand.
- **Singing:** Join the church choir rehearsals on Mondays from 7:30-8:30 p.m. "Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord" (Psalm 95:1).
- **Spiritual Gifts Inventory:** We are meeting in my office on Sundays following worship for conversation, discernment, and a light lunch through December 15. Our small group has been meeting for three weeks, but it's never too late to join us!
- **Giving Back to the Community:** We are hosting the Ottawa Food Pantry on December 9, 10, 16, & 17. The pantry is open to new and old volunteers of all ages!
- **Christmas Joy Offering**: One of three special PC(USA) offerings throughout the year, the Christmas Joy Offering provides an opportunity to support ministers, missionaries, church workers, and their families in times of need. You can contribute financially to this mission via the giving boxes located in the sanctuary. Please return your Christmas Joy Offering box on December 22.
- Children's Christmas Play: With Ms. Nancy and Ms. Carrie, the children are preparing a Christmas play. They work on it during the Sunday School hour that runs from 9-9:50 a.m. If your child is interested in participating, please join us! The Christmas play will be presented on December 22 at our 10 a.m. worship.

### We are in search of a new Nursery worker. The Job description is listed below. If you know anyone who is interested, please contact Victoria Otto at 419-230-7292 or Rev. Amy at 419-890-9145.

#### Title: Child Care Provider - Nursery

**Purpose:** To provide adequate and safe child care for infants through Kindergarten aged children during worship services and other times as needed. This is a paid ministry position.

Accountability: Pastor, and Christian Education Session Chair Member

#### **Responsibilities:**

- Nursery Care will come in appropriate attire for the day.
- Prepare the room for care time. For example: make toys accessible, check the changing table for supplies and linens.
- If there are any planned activities, have materials prepared before children enter the room.
- Greet the children and parents. Label any personal items with child's name.


Introduce yourself to new parents and to children as they enter the room.

- Have the parents sign their child in, and make sure to have a way to contact them.
- Maintain control in a loving and pleasant manner.
- Set aside toys that have been in a child's mouth and wash the toy before another friend plays with the toy.
- Notify the Nursery Committee chairperson or Pastor if repairs or replacements are needed.
- Report any supplies that are needed before next Sunday.
- Children are to stay inside the room. Parents will come to the door at the end of the care time and sign them out.
- Notify parents if unusual situations arose and have affected the children.
- Return the room to order, putting away toys, cleaning the table or chairs if necessary, and making sure children's belongings are taken by the parents.
- Sanitize toys and make sure anything that needs washed gets to the Christian Education Session Chair Member.

**Relationships:** Parents, Pastor, Custodian, and Christian Education Session Chair Member. **Evaluation:** Performance reviews will be conducted annually by the Personnel Committee and/or the Pastor as head of staff.

**Compensation** – The childcare provider will be paid \$40 each Sunday upon receipt of a time sheet submitted to the Church Treasurer. The expected service time will be from 9:45 am until approximately 11:15. The childcare provider shall be responsible for staying in the nursery with all children under care until they are retrieved by their parent or guardian and the nursery is cleaned up.
