Dear friends,

Psalm 107 reads, "Oh give thanks to the LORD, for He is good, for His

steadfast love endures forever!" I do rejoice in the Lord, knowing that God's goodness and love pour out in this congregation! I extend a personal thank you for the caring and generosity that you all demonstrated during the month of February with the loss of my mother; and I thank you for sharing your gifts of ministry, proclamation, worship leadership, prayer support, baking, and much more as you tended to the needs of this community and supported one another in my absence. We have all been generously blessed with gifts to share, and the Spirit guides us to use them in ways that nurture this community.

Looking to the future, spring is upon us!! I can feel it in the air with warmer temperatures and generous rain showers. With spring come Lenten promises of reconciliation, redemption, and new life! We will begin this Lenten season with an at-home Ash Wednesday devotional. Join us Sunday, March 2, to receive your ashes and the devotional reading that you can share with your family, friends, coworkers, and whomever you feel called to do so on Wednesday, March 5.

Speaking from a personal experience in 2024 at the University of Toledo, sharing ashes with non-Catholic individuals is particularly powerful in an otherwise overwhelmingly Catholic town. Non-Catholics often presume that ashes are "for Catholics" along with fish-fries and abstention from chocolate and cursing. Of course, Ash Wednesday and Lent are much more than these traditional practices! Ash Wednesday and Lent, originally practiced as public penance services in the early Christian church, are observed today by Catholics, Lutherans, Anglicans, Methodists, and Presbyterians, among others; and ashes on the forehead stem from an Old Testament tradition, where ashes were a sign of repentance and humility. When I administered "ashes on the go" last year at UT, I was reminded of the importance of sharing public penance and offering grace and encouragement to those we meet in our everyday experiences. I pray that your

participation in this year's at-home Ash Wednesday experience will be life-giving and will provide an opportunity for you to share the hope of Christ with those you love and those you are yet to meet.
