At the start of the new year, OPC would like to bless the students in our community. We would like to donate school supplies and hygiene products to Ottawa Elementary for the school year. Approximately 16 million children in the U.S. lack access to essential school supplies. This translates to roughly one in four students, or 25%, who can't afford the necessary materials when school starts. This lack of supplies can negatively impact a child's academic performance, self-esteem, and attendance. Statistics show that a significant portion of students, particularly those in low-income situations, experience "hygiene poverty" and struggle to afford basic necessities like soap, shampoo, and deodorant. This can lead to students missing school or being unable to focus on their studies. One in four menstruating students in the US have struggled to afford period products. With donating we can hopefully give students the right start to an amazing year of learning and growing. Giving them one less stress in their life. Before we go back to school, let's enjoy the great outdoors. Our outdoor worship service will be August 10, at the Memorial Park in one of the shelter houses. Please join us with a potluck to follow afterwards.

Please pray for our **Pastor Nominating Committee** is they dedicate time and prayer to the process of finding new pastoral leadership for our church.



In keeping with Vera's wishes, there will be no services held at this time.




